2011 CLINTON LUMBERKINGS – FINAL REPORT & BIOS

First Half: 24-46 (8th, 21.0 GB) ■ **Second Half:** 39-30 (2nd, 2.5 GB) ■ **Season:** 63-76 (6th, 19.0 GB)

Half Empty, Half Full in 75th Season: The Clinton LumberKings celebrated the 75th anniversary of the Clinton Baseball Club with the franchise's 10th trip to the Midwest League Playoffs in the last 14 seasons, but it didn't come easy. The Kings finished dead last amongst the 16 MWL teams in the first half, going just 24-46 and finishing 21 games behind first-place Burlington. At the All-Star Break, both the team average (.227) and the team ERA (4.16) ranked last in the circuit. In the second half, manager **Eddie Menchaca's** LumberKings jumped out to a winning record and never fell below the .500 mark. Clinton stood in **third place or higher and held a playoff spot for 69 of 74 days in the second half**, securing a playoff berth on 8/28 with a 5-2 win over the Beloit Snappers. The Kings lost five of their final seven games in the regular season, but still clinched the top playoff spot in the second half with a 6-1 win at Kane County on 9/3. The LumberKings finished second in the West in the second half with a 39-30 record (a 15-win improvement over the first half) and finished the season sixth in the West, 13th in the Midwest League as a whole (63-76).

Catching Fire: The LumberKings surged from the Wild Card position (3.0 games behind Kane County) to the top playoff seed (4.0 games ahead of the Cougars) with a tremendous 15-game stretch from 8/13 to 8/28 in which they went 13-2. That span included an **eight-game winning streak from 8/21 to 8/28, Clinton's first since the 1997 campaign (4/15/97 to 4/21/97)**. The Kings out-scored opponents 94-51 during the 15 games, hitting .283 (146-for-515) with 13 HR, 90 RBI and posting a 2.96 ERA (45 ER in 137.0 IP).

Playoff Recap: Clinton met up with geographical rival Quad Cities in the first round of the 2011 Midwest League Playoffs, the first postseason match-up of the two clubs since 2005 (Clinton won, 2-0). The River Bandits surged to a 6-0 lead over the first two innings of game one against left-hander Tony Butler (L, 0-1), but the LumberKings battled back to make it a 7-5 deficit on a two-run HR from John Hicks in the sixth and RBI hits from Julio Morban and Hicks in the seventh. Unfortunately, they'd get no closer against the Bandits' bullpen, falling 9-5 in their lone home game. Right-hander Boone Whiting (W, 1-0) allowed three runs over 6.0 innings for the win. Clinton took a 1-0 lead in game two on a solo HR by Mike McGee in the first inning, then snapped a 1-1 tie on Stefan Romero's solo HR in the sixth. Anthony Phillips added an RBI double to give the Kings a 3-1 lead, but Quad Cities scored three times in the bottom of the sixth including the game-winning RBI single from Colin Walsh and held on for a 5-3 win and a series sweep. Left-hander Anthony Fernandez (L, 0-1) fell despite three ER over 6.1 IP while Bandits' lefty Anthony Ferrara (W, 1-0) took the win with three ER over 6.0 IP. Quad Cities would go on to win the Midwest League Championship while the LumberKings watched their title drought extend to 20-straight seasons dating back to 1991 (Clinton Giants).

Thank You, 115,253 Times: The LumberKings drew 115,253 fans to Alliant Energy Field in 2011, the fourth-highest attendance in franchise history. The Clinton Baseball Club has achieved two of its top four single-season attendance marks in the last two seasons, including 123,553 fans in 2010, second all-time. The franchise attendance record remains 1988, when the Clinton Giants drew 127,251 fans to Riverview Stadium.

Arms Race: The Kings' pitching staff rose from dead-last in the MWL in team ERA (4.21) at the half to 8th amongst the 16 teams overall this year with a 3.41 ERA (235 ER in 621.0 IP) in the second half. The ERA was reduced significantly thanks to a **36-start stretch from 7/22 to 8/28 in which Clinton starters went 17-5 with a 2.89 ERA (68 ER in 212.0 IP) and 19 quality starts**. RHP **Stephen Kohlscheen** went 4-0 with a (9 ER in 35.0 IP) with four quality starts, while LHP **Anthony Fernandez** went 4-1 with a 1.64 ERA (10 ER in 54.2 IP) and six quality starts in that span. Fernandez lowered his ERA 1.37 points over his final 14 outings with Clinton (6-2, 2.07, 10 QS), **finishing with the Midwest League's sixth-lowest ERA of 2.80**.

Feeling a 2011 Draft: The Kings were boosted by second-half performances from three members of Seattle's 2011 draft class, outfielder **Mike McGee**, catcher **John Hicks** and shortstop **Brad Miller**. McGee, the 15th round pick out of Florida State University joined Clinton on 6/27 and reached base in a team-best 16-straight games from 6/28 to 7/16. **McGee went on to reach base in 53 of 60 games**, notching multi-hit efforts in 21 games...he hit .283 (67-for-237) with four HR and 29 RBI. Hicks, the Mariners' fourth-round pick out of the University of Virginia joined the team on 7/8, but didn't catch fire until 8/17, **when he began a nine-game hitting streak** that would raise his average from .241 to .314. Hicks hit .302 (42-for-139) with two HR and 26 RBI in 38 games, 20 of those RBI coming in August. Miller, Seattle's second-round pick out of Clemson University and the 2011 ACC Player of the Year joined the Kings on 8/19 and hit in 11 of 14 games, batting .415 (22-for-53) with seven RBI...**he finished the year with a six-game hit streak (13-for-25, .520)**.

Power Trio: **Stefan Romero, Kalian Sams and Mickey Wiswall** each finished the year with 10-plus home runs and 50-plus RBI. Romero, Seattle's 12th round pick out of the University of Oregon in 2010, hit a team-best .280 (120-for-429) with 22 doubles (1st on team), 16 HR (2nd) and 65 RBI (1st) and posted a team-best .803 OPS in 116 games. **Romero hit .314 (83-for-264) with 13 HR and 50 RBI over his final 53 games of the season**, including a team-best 13-game hitting streak from 7/25 to 8/8. Sams launched a club-best 18 HR and drove in 56, hitting .237 (76-for-321)...he put together the team's longest RBI streak of six games from 5/31 to 6/5 during a week in which he'd win the MWL Offensive Player of the Week award. Sams has 69 career HR, 34 coming as a LumberKing. Wiswall, the seventh-round pick out of Boston College last year, hit .240 (122-for-509) with 10 HR, 57 RBI in 130 games...his best month was June, when he hit .309 (30-for-97) with five HR and 14 RBI. **Kevin Rivers** also hit 10 HR, batting .249 with 40 RBI in 87 games.

Bullpen Briefs: The bullpen went a combined 24-29 with a 3.76 ERA (194 ER in 464.2 IP), 28 holds and 36 saves during the regular season. RHP **Tyler Burgoon** led all Clinton relievers in ERA (2.30), saves (14), wins (5) and WHIP (1.12), throwing 29 scoreless outings in 42 appearances on the year...he was scored upon just six times in his final 23 outings, going 3-2 with eight saves and a 2.17 ERA (9 ER in 37.1 IP) in that span. RHP **Jonathan Arias** allowed seven runs over his last 7.1 innings but still went 5-1 with nine saves and a 2.40 ERA (13 ER in 49.1 IP) since May...he struck out 101 batters over 63.1 innings for a **14.35 K/9.0 IP average, leading all MWL relievers**. RHP **Jessie Nava** (2-4, 3.28, 4 SV), RHP **Matt Bischoff** (4-3, 3.38, 2 SV), LHP **Ryan Kiel** (0-2, 3.54, 1 SV, 6 Holds) and RHP **John Taylor** (0-2, 3.78, 1 SV) all had sub-4.00 ERAs.

Need for Speed: The LumberKings finished **third in the Midwest League in stolen bases**, swiping 166 bags in 237 attempts (70% success rate)...only Dayton (228 SB) and Fort Wayne (220 SB) had more team steals. Six-different Clinton players finished with at least 10 steals including **Kalian Sams**, who stole a team-high 25 bases in 29 attempts (86%). **Anthony Phillips** went 23-for-34 (68%) despite hitting just .199, while **Tim Morris**, who had just two-career steals entering the season, went 21-for-27 (78%) on the basespaths.

“Sky” is the Limit: 19-year-old RHP **Taijuan “Sky” Walker** turned plenty of heads during his professional debut in 2011 with the LumberKings. Seattle’s 2010 first-round pick (43rd overall) went 0-2 with a 9.95 over his first two starts (road losses at Peoria and at Quad Cities), but was 6-3 with a 2.39 ERA (24 ER in 90.1 IP) over his next 16 starts with Clinton. That span included his first-career complete game victory on 7/13 vs. Great Lakes...he gave up a two-run HR to Blake Dean in the first inning but allowed just one single the rest of the way, yielding two runs on two hits while striking out seven in the Kings’ 6-2 victory at Alliant Energy Field. Walker went 2-0 with a 0.60 ERA (1 ER in 15.0 IP) over his last three starts, lowering his ERA from 3.31 to 2.89...**that ERA was eighth-lowest amongst all MWL pitchers** at the time. Walker was also amongst MWL leaders in lowest opponent average (3rd at .202), highest K/9.0 IP ratio for starters (4th at 10.52), fewest baserunners/9.0 IP for starters (5th at 10.33), strikeouts (6th with 113) and WHIP (8th at 1.12) following his final start on 8/10 vs. Cedar Rapids. **He was named the top Midwest League prospect in 2011 by Baseball America editor Jim Callis on 9/27.**

K-Pax to the Future: Left-hander **James Paxton** brought his brilliance to a league-wide stage in the 2011 Midwest League All-Star Game on 6/21 at Modern Woodmen Park in Davenport, IA, **pitching a perfect third inning for the West Division**. Clinton’s lone All-Star representative struck out West Michigan’s **Hernan Perez** on a fastball, sat down South Bend’s **Ender Inciarte** swinging on a curveball and induced West Michigan’s **Rob Brantly** into an inning-ending lineup to left...he would not factor in the decision as the West won 8-3 over the East. Seattle’s 4th round pick in 2010, Paxton went 3-3 with a 2.70 ERA (15 ER in 50.0 IP), 30 walks and a team-high 73 strikeouts over nine starts in the first half with Clinton, his first pro assignment. The Ladner, BC, Canada also appeared in the XM Satellite Radio All-Star Futures Game on 7/10 at Chase Field in Phoenix, AZ. “K-Pax” pitched a scoreless third inning for the World squad, retiring **Jason Kipnis** (CLE) on a tapper to the mound, **Manny Machado** (BAL) on a fly-out to right and **Bryce Harper** (WAS) on a ground-out to first...the US team went on to win, 6-4. Paxton joins 3B **John Whittleman** (1-for-1, HR at ‘07 game in San Francisco) as the only Kings to play in the Futures Game during the same season in which they’ve been in Clinton. He’d finish the season at double-A Jackson, going 3-0 with a 1.85 ERA and a .201 opponent average in seven starts for the Generals.

Kings Take Home Three Weekly Awards: LumberKings were awarded Midwest League Player of the Week awards on three separate occasions in 2011. **Kalian Sams** took home his first MWL Offensive Player of the Week award on 6/6 following a red-hot week from 5/30 to 6/5...he hit .429 (12-for-28) with four HR, 12 RBI and five steals in eight games, helping the Kings to a 5-1 road trip through Fort Wayne (3-0) and Lake County (2-1). **Kevin Rivers** won the MWL Offensive Player of the Week award on 7/25 after hitting .522 (12-for-23) with four HR and six RBI in six games...he went 9-for-13 with five extra-base hits and five RBI in a three-game series at South Bend during that span. RHP **Stephen Kohlscheen** was the only King to take home a MWL Pitcher of the Week award in 2011, that accolade coming after a victory over his road win over Burlington on 8/7...he went 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out six in Clinton’s 4-1 win over the Bees. **Below is a list of Clinton’s award winners during the 2011 season:**

Cardiac Kings: The LumberKings won 13 times in their final at-bat during 2011 including four times in “walk-off” fashion at home...that’s just two last at-bat wins less than last year’s club (15 last at-bat wins, 6 walk-offs). Four of the final at-bat wins came at the expense of the Peoria Chiefs...**Steven Baron** drew a bases-loaded walk to force home the winning run in a 5-4 victory in 14 innings on 5/6 at O’Brien Field, **Mickey Wiswall** lifted a game-winning sacrifice fly to give Clinton a 3-2 win in 10 innings on 7/3 at O’Brien Field, **Carlos Ramirez** lined a two-out, two-run single to give the Kings a stunning 3-1 win over the Chiefs in the 10th inning on 7/31 at Alliant Energy Field and Ramirez victimized Peoria again on 8/13, belting a two-run HR in the top of the 10th to secure a 3-1 win at O’Brien Field. Two of the LumberKings’ walk-off wins came in the opening homestand of the second half...**Robbie Anston** lined a ninth-inning walk-off single to center for a 5-4 win over Burlington on 6/24 and **Stefen Romero** downed Beloit two days later with a single to right-center that provided a 4-3 win in 12 innings. The Kings also posted two last at-bat wins in the same series at Fort Wayne thanks to a 10th-inning sacrifice fly by **Kalian Sams** that provided a 4-3 win on 5/31 and a ninth-inning RBI double by **Jabari Blash** that pushed Clinton past the TinCaps, 9-8 on 6/2. **Here’s a look at all of Clinton’s last at-bat wins in 2011:**

By the Series: The LumberKings won 20 series and lost 24 during the regular season...Clinton swept opponents four times (5/31-6/2 @ Fort Wayne, 7/27-7/29 vs. Wisconsin, 8/13-8/15 @ Peoria, 8/24-8/26 @ Cedar Rapids), were swept seven times and split series twice (8/2-8/5 @ Wisconsin, 8/6-8/9 @ Burlington).

About the Staff: The LumberKings were guided by two managers in 2011 as interim manager (and 2009 Kings’ hitting coach) **Jesus Azuaje** started the year while manager **Eddie Menchaca** and wife Lacey welcomed their second son, **Anthony Jaxx Menchaca** on 4/8. Azuaje went 4-8 in his tenure as manager. Menchaca officially took over the club on 4/18...under his guidance, the Kings went 20-38 in the first half and 39-30 in the second half, an improvement of 19 games between halves under his tenure. The first-year Clinton skipper made his second-career trip to the playoffs as the LumberKings finished with the top playoff spot in the West, ultimately falling 2-0 to Quad Cities in the first round. **Menchaca is 96-96 (.500) in two seasons as a manager with Clinton (2011) and rookie Pulaski (2010)** following a seven-year playing career as a shortstop in the Seattle system. Pitching Coach **Rich Dorman** led the LumberKings’ arms from 16th in the MWL in team ERA in the first half (4.21) to eighth in the league (3.41) by season’s end. His third year as a pitching coach in the Mariners’ system (first with Clinton) saw his development of pitching prospects **Taijuan Walker, James Paxton, Anthony Fernandez, Carter Capps, Jonathan Arias, Tyler Burgoon** and others. Hitting Coach **Terry Pollreisz** returned to his post after leading the LumberKings to a .259 team average (7th in the MWL) and a franchise-record 134 home runs (1st in the MWL) in 2010. His 2011 offense struggled, finishing 15th amongst the 16 teams with a .238 average and 14th in hits (1,093), total bases (1,632), slugging percentage (.356) and OPS (.667). Still, they qualified for the postseason for the second-straight year under his watch. Pollreisz completed his 13th season as a coach in the Mariners system, second with Clinton in 2011. Trainer **Jake Naas** and Performance Specialist **Will Lindholm** completed their first seasons with the LumberKings as well in 2011.

“Major” Promotions: Ten former LumberKings made Major League debuts in 2011, raising the all-time total of former Clinton players to make the big leagues to 234. Right-hander **Tom Wilhelmson** and left-hander **Anthony Vasquez** both reached the Majors with the Seattle Mariners one season removed from pitching in Clinton, with Wilhelmson making the jump straight from the LumberKings to the Mariners. Here’s a look at the ten former Kings who reached “The Show” this year:

- Recorded 3 of his 8 hits on 6/14 vs. Quad Cities, going 3-for-4 with three singles in a 5-0 loss to the River Bandits.

- Joined LumberKings on 5/9 from extended Spring Training and was with the team for remainder of the season...made 22 starts in left field, 15 starts in center field.
- Hit .324 (11-for-34) with 2 doubles, triple, 8 runs scored, 4 RBI and a .941 on-base percentage during 11 games in May, his hottest month at the plate.
